## 2015 Part-time Engineering Intern

is one of Canada's most innovative active and sustainable transportation organizations (ASTO) promoting urban bicycle commuting. *CtdnS* is the event planner of the 'Ride the Road' Tour and the first Calgary Bicycle Festival. Since 2009 we have been driving the commuter cycling agenda in Calgary. The ['Ride the Road' tour](#) is the genesis of our 2010 legislative initiative at City Hall, which is designed to be the initial step in building separated bike lanes (dedicated bicycle infrastructure) in downtown Calgary.

2012 is the fortieth anniversary of a five million dollar Council decision to fund on-street bike infrastructure. *CtdnS* is celebrating the event with the launch of a significant research project – the downtown Bicycle Parking Inventory Study. The study now in the test phase has involved dozens of telephone and personal interviews of facilities managers representing building owners, operators and major tenants.

The Engineering Intern will expand upon a high level scoping report that assessed the practicality of the 'Road Diet' proposal. This was completed by an engineering firm supporting our objectives to achieve 'more people cycling more often'.

If you are passionate about bringing about a revolutionary change in attitudes towards active and sustainable transportation in Calgary then we want to hear from you.

The role of the 'Engineering Intern' is:

- Conduct a literature review
- Develop detailed descriptions of relevant and current standards for physically separated bicycle infrastructure
- Create a project management plan for physically separated bike lanes
- Assess alternative proposals
- Provide content for communications (traditional and social media)

Qualifications:

- Excellent research skills
- Enrolment in a relevant engineering discipline
- Methodical approach to data collection
- Computer skills (Microsoft Office Suite)
- Excellent verbal skills
- Ability to function in a team environment with multi-disciplinary members

This position is available under the [Serving Communities Internship Program](#) and certain eligibility conditions apply. Previous students in this position were invited to North America's top commuter cycling conference to present. Schedule is a flexible 80 hours over the next nine months.
